






What would be the difference between a self-centered and a God-centered life?

A self-centered person would be: proud of their accomplishments, depending on themselves and their abilities, looking at circumstances from a human perspective, and would seek to be acceptable to the world and its ways.

A God-centered person would be: placing their confidence in God and His ability, being humble before God, seeking first His kingdom and righteousness, and would look for His perspective in every circumstance.





Countless times across the Bible, we see people act according to their self-focused desires from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil. Let's read **Genesis 2:16-17 and 3:1-7.**

God specifically told Adam and Eve not to eat from the tree. It was a direct command from the Father. Then we see Eve being tempted and in verse 6 of chapter 3, she gives the fruit her attention by focusing on it. She then sees it looks good and she desires the wisdom it would give her. Not only did this lead her astray but Adam too.

Eve wasn't functioning with a foundation built on God. Her sinful actions came from a foundational issue; a focus on her wants and desires. Having a foundation based on self is a sneaky trap because it makes sense from a human perspective. Say we find ourselves in a situation where we feel disappointed by someone else. It makes sense to react with anger or resentment when we are focused on ourselves, but when we focus on God's perspective over that situation, our outlook can be utterly transformed. By building our foundation on God's principles, we are bound to yield greater fruit.

This doesn't mean God is a hard taskmaster who doesn't give us what we need. No, He wants to give us the desires of our hearts, but we must first delight in Him (Psalm 37:4).
